FY 2023 newly launched pilot programs:

- Social Emotional Learning Tutorial (SEL-T) In 2002, the Innovation Fund seeded BHS Tutorial for students needing content-based academic tutoring and executive function skills development. BHS faculty are now piloting a new Tutorial section for students requiring social-emotional skills to achieve academic success. This SEL-T pilot helps students learn to identify stressors, and developing coping strategies, and cultivating self-regulation skills to enhance academic and social success at school. BHS faculty trained in SEL pedagogy subsequently train other teachers with the goal of integrating these practices into courses across the curriculum.
- Data Science for Social Justice Proposed by the Math Department, this data science course explores social justice topics to teach data analysis skills: understand sampling, distinguish correlation from causation, recognize bias, and use probability and modeling to create and support data-based Topics encompass racism, healthcare inequities, arguments. political underrepresentation, and gun violence. Students learn how to use spreadsheets, coding (Python or R) and data analysis technology in their research.

FY 2023 special awards:

- Innovation Fellow Provided a faculty member with time during the academic year to develop curriculum, structures, partnerships to further the work of Sexual Harassment, Assault and Rape Prevention (SHARP) Warriors.
- Extended funding for Advisory/Hub (12th grade) -The Fund has invested in this program since Fall 2019, with the principal goal of fostering connections among students and a faculty advisor in a non-evaluative setting. This grant extension allows faculty to train additional faculty to become advisors and expands the program into a four-year experience for BHS students.

FY 2023 continuing multi-year pilot program:

- Rethinking Restaurant Students take the lead in running TappanGreen's business. In addition, the restaurant offers cocurricular experiences for the entire BHS community, including culinary cultural exchanges and interdisciplinary collaborations to implement sustainable business practices. (Year 2 of 2)
- Climate Science and Social Change An interdisciplinary teamtaught elective with instruction from both the scientific and historical perspectives. The course engages students in projectbased learning, allowing them to analyze real world policy options related to climate change and propose definable and effective solutions. Seniors engage in advocacy campaigns aimed at shaping perceptions on climate change and encourage personal mitigation strategies. (Year 2 of 3)
- Coding @ BHS -An interdepartmental collaboration between Math, Science and Career and Technical Education departments, which embeds computer science exercises into all math and science courses.

This prepares students who wish to pursue careers in the computer science field; equips all students with coding knowledge and problem-solving exposure that is applicable to a wide variety of career paths; and addresses systemic inequities that hinder students of color and young women from entering the computer science fields. In addition, the following twenty courses and programs that were originally created, developed and piloted by the Fund were active in the 2022-23 BHS curriculum:

- Advisory Hub (9th-11th grades) Providing time within the regular academic schedule for student cohorts to facilitate collaborative sessions that support the goals and values of the school. Integrating practices such as Finding Yourself in the Curriculum, Mindfulness (both Fund initiatives), and Restorative Justice
- 2. African-American and Latino Scholars Program Supporting students of color to achieve academic success and fostering a culture of serious, invigorating scholarship
- 3. **Arts Infusion Lab** Building confidence and expressive capacity in under-involved students through art activities
- 4. BHS Tutorial Providing individualized content-based tutoring to enhance the academic performance of students, increasing comprehension and strengthening underdeveloped study skills
- 5. BHS Writes/The Writing Center Nurturing a writing culture at BHS that reaches all levels of its community
- 6. Brookline Lens Giving students business management skills in addition to developing their art as part of a student-run enterprise that provides photography and videography services to community clients in a fully-functional production house
- 7. Drawing for Understanding in Field Science Engaging students in demonstrating scientific knowledge through art and in developing the cross-disciplinary skills shared by artists and scientists: observing, hypothesizing, looking for patterns, and making inferences about what they see
- 8. Engineering by Design Inspiring student interest in the field of engineering through a hands-on, project-based curriculum that teaches the fundamentals of iterative problem solving through a series of collaborative design challenges
- 9. Engineering Innovation & Design Integrating principles of engineering and aesthetics into physical products that integrate functionality and artistry; taught in a collaborative makerspace setting
- 10. EPIC for Seniors: Experiential, Project-based Innovative Capstone Offering intensive independent-learning opportunities for seniors to conceptualize, design, direct and drive hands-on projects
- 11. Experiential Physics (9th Grade) Integrating scientific, engineering, and entrepreneurial curriculum in parallel with the construction of new physics labs which have expanded applied learning opportunities

- 19. Social Justice Leadership Program Training a youth corps of social justice advocates through group activities and internships in local social justice organizations
- 20. **Teachers Mentoring Teachers Program** Training, supporting and retaining a world-class faculty at BHS

In addition, many initiatives have been completed or dynamically integrated into the school's current curriculum, including: the Headmaster Action Plan, Content Reading Initiative, Innovation Summit, Political Literacy, Family Partnership, Tripod Project, CyberCitizens and Good Citizen in a Good Society.

At the close of FY 2023, the Fund has approved funding for numerous program commitments for the 2023-2024 school year, including:

- Continuation of funding for Data Science and Social Justice, Social Emotional Learning Tutorial, and Climate Science and Social Justice.
- 2. A special award for the Reimagined Social Justice Leadership Program The SJLP was conceived in 2007 with support from the Fund. A new faculty member will lead the program in '23-'24. The reimagined program will integrate academics from the disciplines of Psychology, Ethics, History, and Sociology as they relate to social justice and prepare students to take action through internships and school/community improvement projects all guided by the ethics of care.
